Palm Springs City Council, leaf blowers wrong target

The wrong target

In promoting sustainability, Palm Springs misguidedly targets "leaf blowers" while giving motorized lawnmowers free passes. Motorized blowers make no more noise, use no more gas and emit no more emissions or particulates than motorized lawnmowers.
